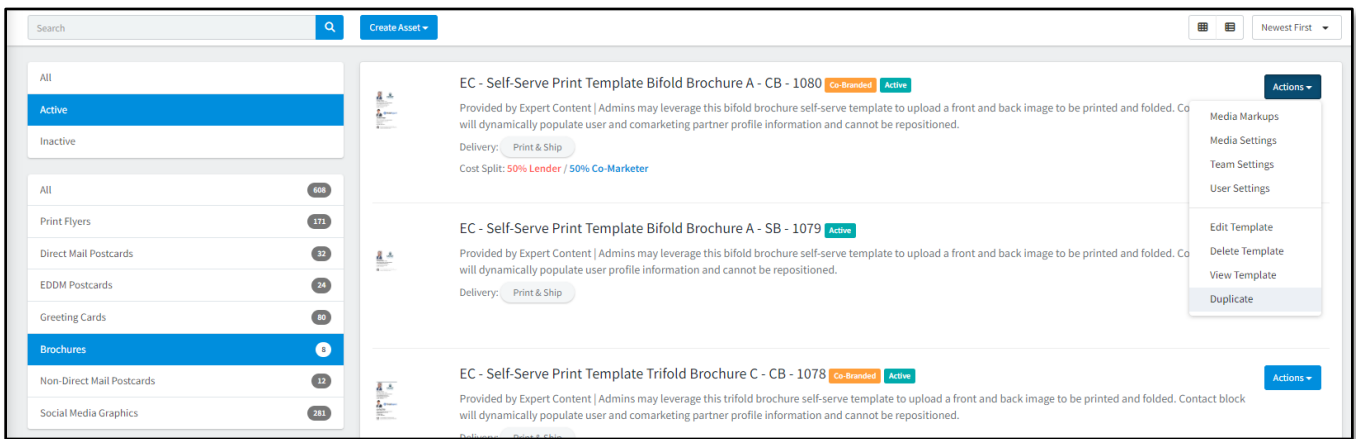




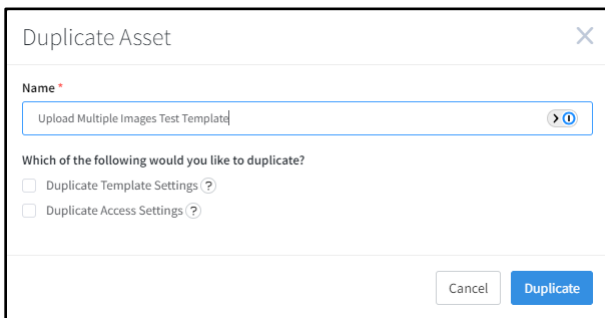
Editing a Print Template with Multiple Background Images

Some print templates support more than 1 background image. For example, a 2-page brochure could have a different background on each page. When setting up this type of template to be used, you should specify images for each placeholder.

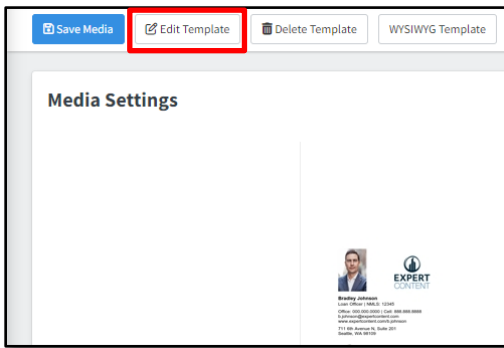
1. Navigate to **Manage Marketing** → **Manage Templates**.
2. Locate the template you want to work with by scrolling the list, by using the search bar, or by selecting folders and/or tags.
3. Select **Actions** → **Duplicate**.



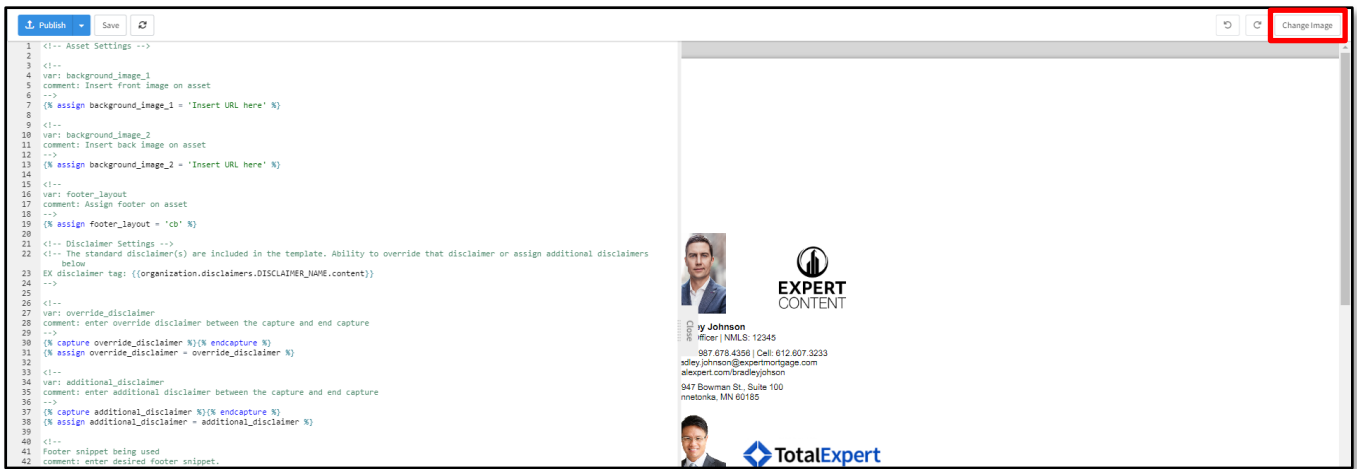
4. In the Duplicate Asset box:
 - a. In the **Name** field, enter a name for the duplicate asset.
 - b. (optional) Check the **Duplicate Template Settings** box if you want attributes of the template itself (such as folders, tags, and cost sharing) to be copied to the duplicate. Hover the mouse pointer over the **(?)** icon for a full list of these settings.
 - c. (optional) Check the **Duplicate Access Settings** box if you want the access settings of the template (such as user and team settings and co-marketing partner access) to be copied to the new duplicate. Hover the mouse pointer over the **(?)** icon for a full list of these settings.
 - d. Click the **Duplicate** button.



5. You are routed to the Media Settings page for the new asset. Click the **Edit Template** button.

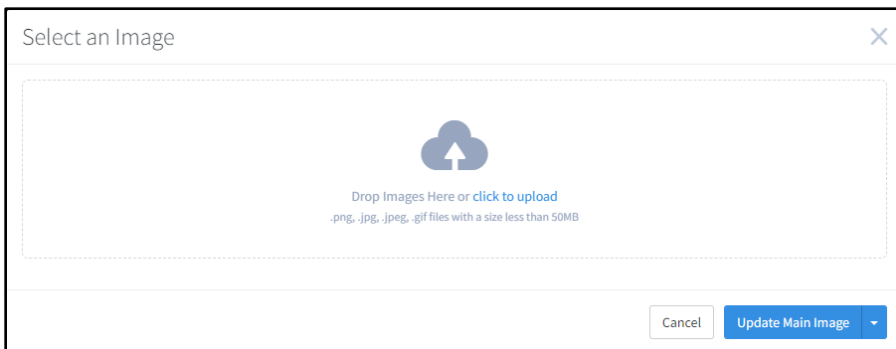


6. In the editor, click the **Change Image** button in the upper-right corner.



7. In the Select an Image box:

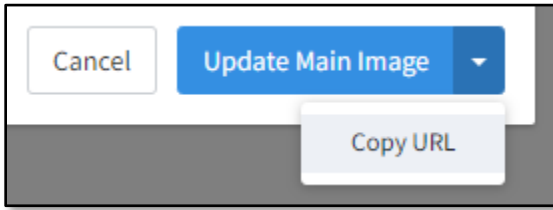
- Upload an image file by either clicking in the **click to upload** area and navigating to the image file you want to add or by dragging a file and dropping it in this area.
- Click the **Update Main Image** button. This applies the URL to the first image toggle in the code editor on the left side of the page.



8. Click the **Change Image** button again to upload another image.

9. Add a file to the Select an Image box as before. Do *not* click the Update Main Image button.

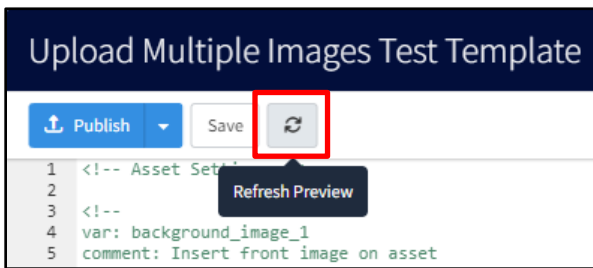
10. With the 2nd image selected, click the drop-down arrow next to the Update Main Image button and select **Copy URL**.



11. In the code editor, locate the code line for the 2nd background image and select the text `Insert URL here`. Do *not* select the quotation marks surrounding it.

12. With the text selected, right-click on it and select **Paste** (or use a keyboard shortcut such as `[Ctrl] + [V]` to paste). The URL is inserted to replace the selected placeholder text.
13. Click the **Refresh Preview** button to see the result of your changes in the preview section on the right side of the page.



14. Save and publish the asset as you would with any other print asset.
